

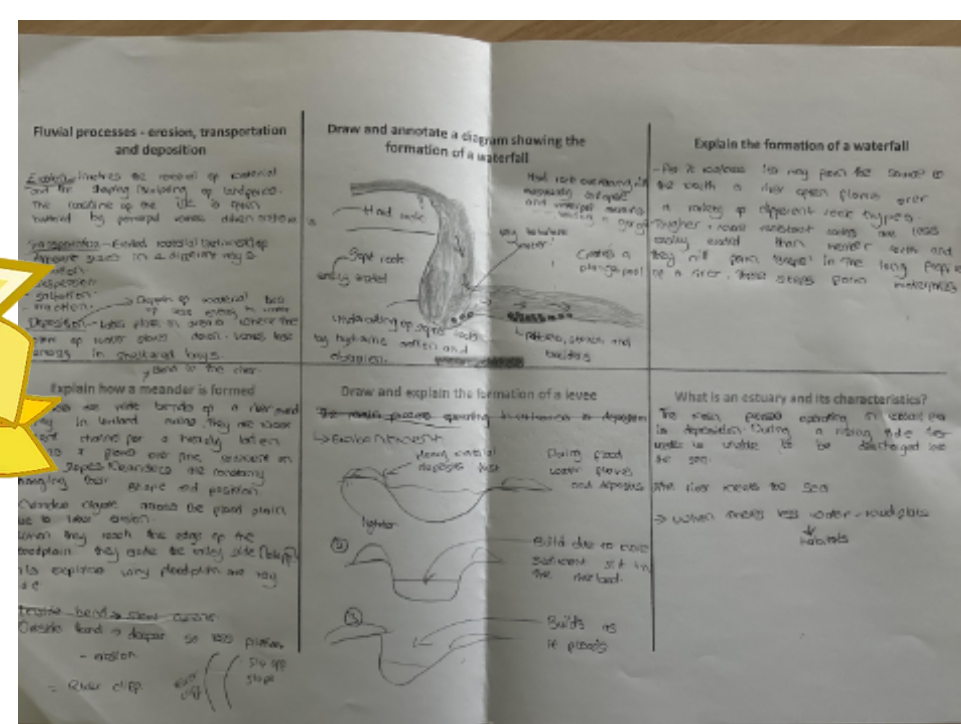
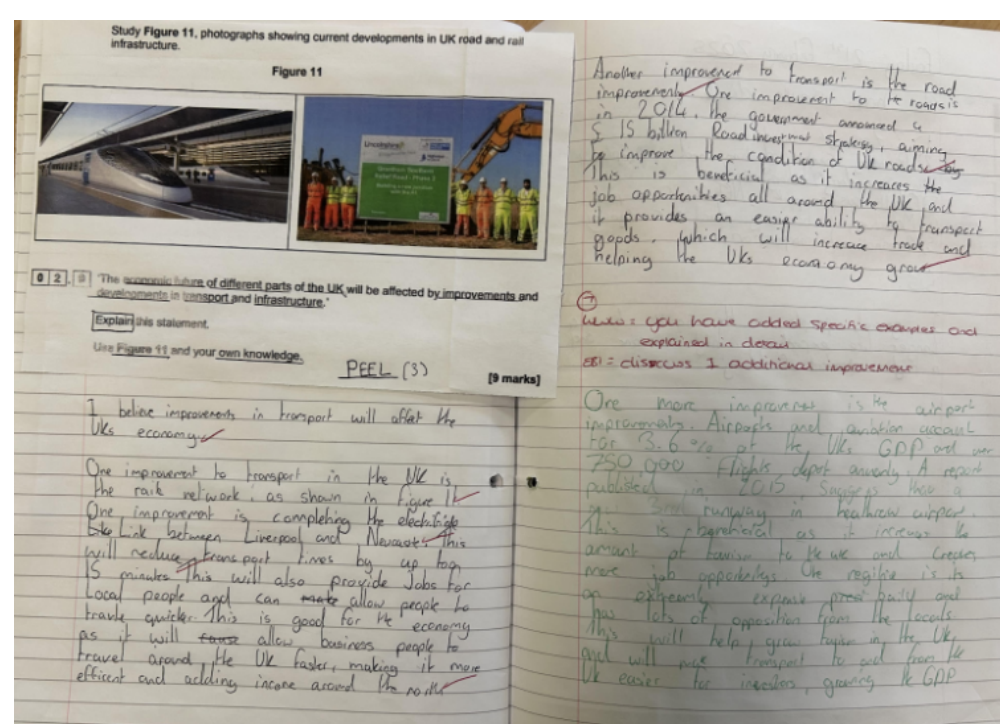

A Spotlight on Revision....

Flash Cards

Flashcards are small note cards used for testing and improving memory through practiced information retrieval. Flashcards are typically two-sided, with the prompt on one side and the information about the prompt on the other.

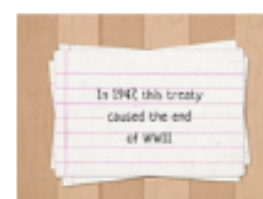
How to make flash cards

1. Either buy a set of blank flash cards or create your own by cutting up card or paper.
2. On one side of the card, write a key term or question.
3. On the other side, write the definition for that key term, or an answer to the question.



How to ensure effective use of flash cards

- Stick to one idea or concept per flash card.
- Don't fill the card with a long complex answer either. Keep them as simple as possible.
- To achieve this, split bigger answers into smaller sets of questions if necessary, and don't worry if this means using more cards.
