

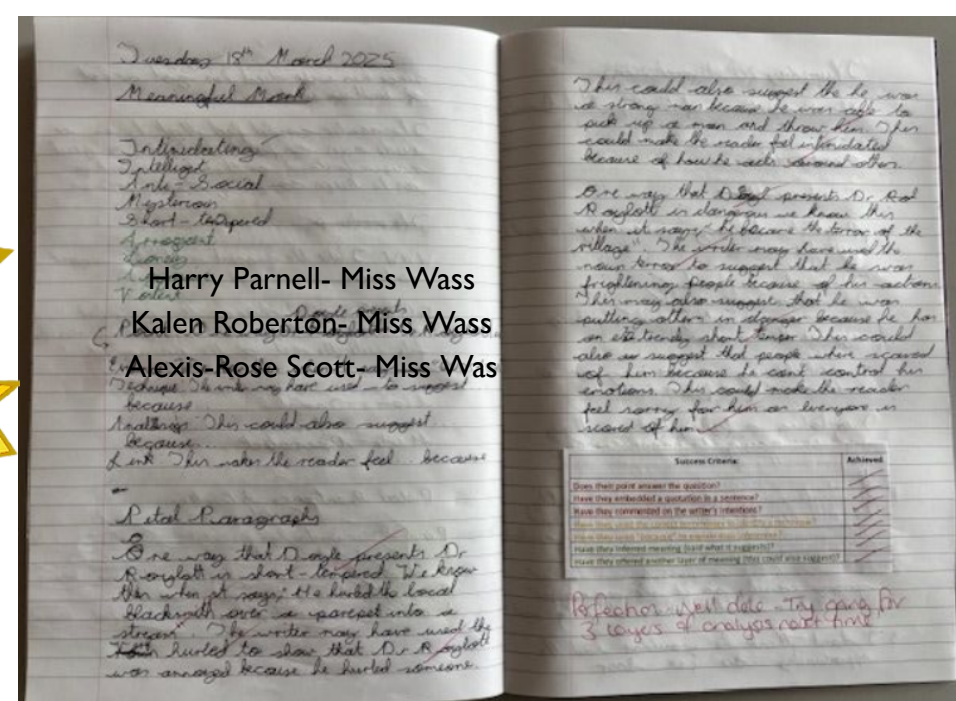
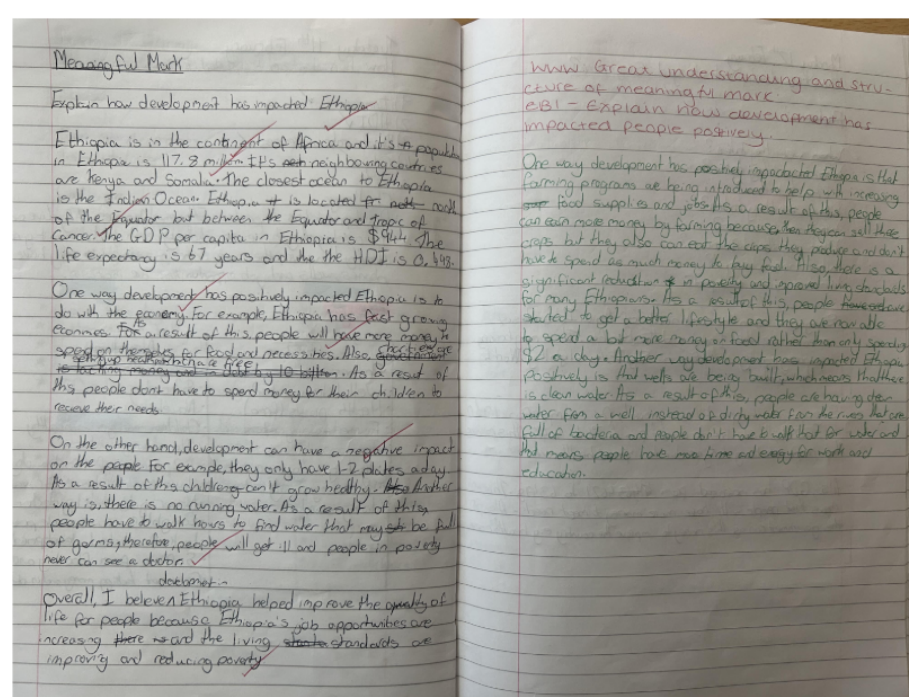
A Message from Mr Johnson
